

GWC Board of Directors Meeting Wednesday, April 25, 2018



The GWC April Board meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by President Tom Quigley at the Red, Hot & Blue restaurant in Fairfax, Virginia.

Attendance: Jason Cunningham (by conference call), Stan Johnson, James Kolody, Benny Leonard, Jamie Lucas, Tom Quigley, Bill Sims, Milford Sprecher, and Doug Tomb were in attendance. A quorum was present. Bruce Metcalf, Greg Shepherd, and Bill Worsham were unable to attend.

Minutes of the March BOD meeting were approved and published in the April Script.

### President's Report:

President Tom Quigley opened the meeting by stating that the proposal for upgrading the large screen TV at the American Legion Monthly Meeting space had been put on hold. The American Legion had expressed a preference for a different approach, so the whole matter has been tabled for now.

Tom also announced that the Model A Restorers Club (MARC) has awarded GWC the MARC Award Of Merit for the Club's Script Newsletter. Congratulations go to Bill Sims, GWC Editor, and all the Club members who submit articles, news items, and pictures for publication. We have a First Class Club Newsletter.

### Vice President – Stan Johnson - Programs:

- The May Monthly Meeting will be the last Club meeting before Sully. Stan will have the program focus on the history of the Club's Sully Show. The Sully staff will come and present the history of the Sully historic site to the Club. Jim Gray offered to put together a multimedia presentation on the Sully judging for this year and go over administrative details of the show.
- The June Monthly Meeting program will cover Model A wheels and tires. Stan hopes to use the Club's GoPro camera to film some wheel and tire preparation at Benny's garage using the Club's wheel-straightening equipment
- The July Outdoor Swap Meet program will be an ice cream social, with pie and ice cream. Plan to drive your Model A, and bring parts to sell.
- Future programs will include the complete restoration of Benny's coupe, gas tank restoration tips, upholstery for seats and headliner, as well as a presentation on the Model A Ford during Prohibition, among other topics.
- Also suggested was How to evaluate a Model A Ford for purchase. Stay tuned.

Secretary's Report – Doug Tomb is the acting Secretary until a permanent Secretary is found.

### Treasurer's Report – Doug Tomb:

- Doug stated that all the Club bills are current, or in process.
- Doug reported on the latest budget figures, with the current bank balance as of 04/23/18 at \$40,129.33. We are slightly positive for the year, at this point.
- The budget voted on by the Board at the February Board Meeting will be presented to the membership at the May Monthly Meeting.

### **Committee Reports**

President Tom asked for the following Committee Reports:

Annual Sully Meet Chairman – Bill Worsham was unable to attend:

- Jason made the suggestion that we set up a contest at the Sully Show using Instagram or Facebook with a hashtag. The idea is that the Club will have posters at the entrance asking young people to take a picture of their favorite car at the show and post it to the Club hashtag. Jason will review the pictures during the day, and every half hour will pick a winning picture. The submitter of the picture will then win a free snow cone from the Club Snow Cone booth. This should generate lots of activity on Instagram and Facebook for the show and the GWC. A motion was made, and the Board voted to implement Jason's promotional idea at this year's Sully.
- . Tom also asked that the Club banner be displayed at this year's Sully, with the Club's new logo. James will print up a banner and bring it to the show.
- Benny reported on the latest layout for the Flea Market area at Sully. This year, the Flea Market has been consolidated in one area, which should make it more accessible to people.
- Benny also reports that we are expecting more Model T Fords this year. (Well, at least they are Fords.)

### Activities Chairman -- Jason Cunningham:

- Jason reported that Small Parts Day was a success, and the Cherry Blossom Parade went well, with eight Model A Fords in the parade. The video is available on the Club web site.
- The Club visit to Oak Hill, President Monroe's estate in Aldie, is scheduled for Sunday, May 20th. Participants MUST DRIVE a Model A Ford to gain entrance. Fifty seven Club members have signed up so far.
- After that, the Memorial Day Parade in downtown D.C is Monday, May 28th. The registration forms are on the Club web site. The more the merrier.
- Jason mentioned the Fort Hunt Park event on June 9<sup>th</sup>. The Park Service would like to have us come and park our cars for display between 1:00 and 3:00 PM during their event. A side trip to nearby Mount Vernon is possible too.
- Jason would like to have one weekend Club activity per month.
- Jason is working with Mike Pangia on a return trip to Kent Island. Stay tuned.
- Jason would also like to have a tour to the Skyline Drive, as we have done in past years. He is working on the details.
- Jason stated that Club members are needed to volunteer to help out with the Jaeger Picnic, the Warhurst Picnic, and the Christmas Party. We need ladies gift ideas for the Christmas Party and volunteers to find them.
- The Club needs the membership to step up to help on these activities to spread the workload around, and to make them more enjoyable for all.

- Benny also reported that he will announce the Club Sully Sign Preparation Day for some time in May or early June.

### Youth Development - James Kolody:

- James said the Scholarship Application is on the Club Website. He has received one completed application to date. The deadline is May 1st for submissions, so candidates should get them in.

### THE GEORGE WASHINGTON CHAPTER 25 YEARS AGO

With Sully '93 fast approaching, members were asked to come early to the May meeting, pick up their gate passes from the respective Committee Chairman and get the time/location for their work assignment. "Last chance to sign up for a committee" was the plea, and help was still needed, especially for the front gate, flea market and judging. As always, GWC'ers came through.



A memorable treat awaited members--coming up at the May meeting was a visit by the living expert, George DeAngelis, who started work at the Ford Motor Company as an apprentice tool and die maker in the early '40's. He retired in 1980 as supervisor of the Technical Illustration Section in Ford's General Services Division, Dearborn, Michigan. His presentation was titled "Model A Production Line Methods," with slides from original production-line photographs. George was best known as the first author, along with co-authors Ed Francis and Les Henry, of the widely acclaimed book, The Ford Model A - As Henry Built It. It was based on extensive factory technical and photographic data, giving an authentic description of the Model A as it was produced and modified over and over, from 1927 through 1931. We were indeed privileged to have this outstanding speaker address us.

The Chapter's Family Night went over well despite a spring downpour, and members were rewarded with food and fun. Club-supplied barbeque was said to have been out of this world. A recipe was given in the Ford Script for broccoli-ham gratin, a dish brought by Evelyn Dunn to the event, which brought rave reviews. Pictured there was Ginny Potter in a hat made of balloons by the attending clown, and a broadly grinning Ed Wiencek wearing a hat saying, "I am their LEADER... which way did they go?"

Touting an upcoming July tour was the header, "Let's take an overnight to Paradise!" Paradise, Pa., that is. An 8:30 start from Silver Spring lead to a picnic lunch, then a stop at Schwalm's, the Model A engine rebuilder extraordinaire, who hosted a tour of his facility. 
### **Membership Report**



### **IT'S ALL ABOUT SULLY!**




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### **GWC'S FUTURE PERHAPS?**
