#### **TIP FROM BRUCE HAYNES**

(Reprinted from The March 2017 Generator, the official newsletter of the Old Dominion Chapter/Region in Richmond)

To jumpstart a 6-volt Model A with a 12-volt battery, put the car in neutral, set the parking brake, block the wheels and turn the key on. First, place one jumper cable [it does not matter which one, on the stud on the starter. Next, confirm that the car is in neutral and place the other jumper cable on the frame of the car. As soon as you do that, the starter will engage and turn the engine over. The 12-volt battery will not harm the 6-volt starter unless you crank it for three to five minutes. However, if you jump the 12-volt battery directly to the 6-volt battery, you stand a good chance of a battery explosion.

From his President's Desk Column, Chuck Manns gave special kudos to Judy and Donnie Temple for taking responsibility for the Family Night, their fourth time at the helm. Thanks also went to Truman Burn for arranging, delivering and setting up of the bbq and Robert Mechner for providing the bingo equipment.

The board had been at work addressing a variety of issues that would be if interest to members. One, a 43-point checklist form used by dealers to go over an A or AA extensively. Not a list of repairs and adjustments that would be needed, but rather an action list of tasks the dealer would perform, all for just \$3! #### **SCAMMERS**


As many of you know, I have been trying to sell Tom Terko's Model A. I have listed it in a variety of places, including Craigslist, which often attracts scammers. I have had a couple of emails about it, not specific and asking for pictures and my final price. All the ads have pictures and anyone who wants to negotiate over e-mail has to be a scammer in my book

I got a text message the other day from someone in the 909 area code (California) about the car that had some of the characteristics of a scammer. We texted back and forth and he wanted to know my "final price." Suspicious, but I asked him to call me, which he did. He had a thick accent, said his name was Steve and that he was from New York. I asked where he had seen the ad and he said "modela.com". I assumed it was the Club web site. He wanted more pictures, so I texted him the link from the Craigslist ad. He then texted back and asked if he could send a certified check.

That was the tip off that he was a scammer, so I told him cash only. That was the end of it until the following day when I got another text from him, so he was going through all the ads again, not realizing that he had contacted me yesterday. I did not respond, but I did report the phone number to the FTC and the Maryland Attorney General's office. I don't think there will be any follow-up by either, but I thought it was worth a try.



#### **KENWOOD CHERRY BLOSSOM TOUR**

Shuyan suggested that the Club should have a tour of some of the wonderful cherry blossoms in the area. The Tidal Basin, while wonderful, is always mobbed and not car friendly, so I thought I would organize a trip to the Kenwood neighborhood in Bethesda, which is known for its cherry trees.

Kenwood, is located off of River Road. In the early 1930s and '40s, a local developer planted cherry trees as a way to promote the neighborhood to potential home buyers. Now more than 1,200 trees grace the neighborhood, bearing hundreds of thousands of beautiful, tiny pink and white flowers that bloom during the spring season.

The trees usually reach peak bloom a few days after the Tidal Basin, so I scheduled the tour for April 1, a weekday, when traffic through the neighborhood is lesser than the weekend. The weather forecast was iffy, but the day turned out great, if on the cool side.

We had a pretty hard rain the night before, so I was worried that the trees would have lost many of their blooms, but we were rewarded with trees that still looked good. We drove over on the weekend to see how the trees looked. They were very good and we saw Club member Matt Krafft driving his Model A through the neighborhood while we were there.

Only Bill and Alice Sims joined us for the tour, so we left together from Takoma Park. As our meeting place was the parking lot at Glen Echo Park, we drove there to make sure no one was waiting for us. No Model A's or Club members in the parking lot, so we headed to Kenwood. We were pleased to see the trees in pretty good condition, in spite of the rain. There were quite a few people there, but nothing like the crowds on the weekend.

We parked a couple of places to take pictures of our cars with the trees. Our cars were about as popular as the cherry trees and we had a lot of interest from the other visitors.

After we finished our drive around the neighborhood, we headed to Ledo's Pizza for lunch. I have never been a big Ledo's fan, but this was better than expected. We finished the visit with a stop next door to Sarah's Handmade Ice Cream for an end to our cars, cherry blossoms and calories tour before heading back to Takoma Park. Hopefully we can get more participants

next year, because it is a great destination during cherry blossom season.


#### GEORGIA O'KEEFFE PAINTED FROM THE BACKSEAT OF HER MODEL-A FORD

(From History Facts on the internet.)

Modernist artist Georgia O'Keeffe sought to be closely connected with the scenic New Mexican landscape that was the subject of many of her works. Part of maintaining that connection meant painting outdoors, though the area was known for its unrelenting heat and plentiful bee swarms.

Undeterred, O'Keeffe came up with an idea that would protect her from the elements while she painted. During her first visit to New Mexico, she had purchased a custom Model-A Ford to explore the land with. It had detachable front seats, and she would remove the passenger seat and spin the driver's seat around to face the back. This allowed her to set up a canvas on the back seat while sitting comfortably and using the car as protection from the sun and insects.

O'Keeffe was said to be a fearless driver by her friends, and she took her vehicle throughout the state and set up her mobile art studio wherever she found inspiration. She found opportunities to connect with nature outside of the car as well, often hiking and camping in the desert terrain and bundling up during the colder months so she could continue to paint. O'Keeffe was also known to paint from inside her bedroom window overlooking the Chama River Valley, maintaining that unbreakable connection with nature. The artist's efforts to experience the world around her paid off, as she produced some 2,000 paintings, many of which centered around local flowers and majestic southwestern landscapes.




